

A fast-paced drawing and guessing game for 3 to 5 people aged 12 and up

## What's the game about?

Everyone knows roughly what a guitar looks like. But do you also know the details – the strings, frets, sound hole, and so on? That's great! Then grab a sheet of paper and get drawing. Don't worry, you don't have to be the next Picasso. Your fellow players simply need to be able to recognize the various details. Because these will earn you points.

# So? Who's got the best eye for detail then?

# Content:

51 cards 1 pad of paper

You'll also need some pens and a timer (e.g., on a smartphone).



### How to set up the game:

Shuffle the cards and place them face-down in a pile at the center of the table. Each of you takes a sheet of paper and a pen. Place these ready in front of you. Before you start, decide how many rounds you want to play.

## Our recommendation:



3 pLayers 6 cards

4 pLayers 8 cards

5 pLayers 10 cards

# How to play:

Everyone plays at the same time. The youngest player reads out the word on the top card and starts the timer running for 30 seconds. Now you all draw this word. Once the time is up, all put your pens down and pass your drawing to your left neighbor. The youngest player then turns the card over.

#### Scoring:

Check whether your fellow player has included the details indicated on the card. If so, they receive points.

#### There are several possibilities:

I to 10 points: You can earn between 1 and 10 points depending how difficult the detail is.

#### Beware of the minus points:

If you draw words incorrectly, vou may also receive minus points. These are clearly indicated on the card.

Record their score in the score box at the top of their sheet. Then return the sheet to them ready for the next round. Take a look at the word on the **next** card and start the timer

# End of the game:

The game ends when you have played the number of rounds agreed. Everyone now adds up their points. The player with the most points wins. In case of a tie, there are multiple winners.

Recycle Paper - for endless fun! Have you used up all of the sheets of paper? Then take a look in your Paper bin! The backs of old letters or printouts are great for drawing

on – and help save paper

Add up the points your fellow player has earned and subtract the minus points.
